About:

Jean-Baptiste Lully (1632 - 1687) was a French composer during the Baroque era who, in collaboration with other artists at the time, helped to pioneer early forms of performing arts that we know today, including ballet. Together with the author Molière and choreographer Pierre Beauchamp, the trio wrote Le Bourgeois gentilhomme (The Bourgeois Gentleman). It is a five-act comédieballet – a play intermingled with music, dance, and singing – satirizing bourgeois personality, and poking fun both at the vulgar, pretentious middleclass, and the vain, snobbish aristocracy.

Marche pour la Ceremonie des Turcs (The March for the Turkish Ceremony) is taken from Act IV and depicts the grand procession of Turkish musicians and dancers.
